





Great job on all of the team fundraisers!

- We will be riding a bus together up to Spokane and are flying out from there ... Time TBA






Flights – Middle seats and we are spread throughout the plane

Brief History of Bull Fighting

> 2000 BC on Crete is the earliest form of Bull Competitions - Bull Leaping pictured below




Around 700 AD the Moors killed bulls from horseback on the Iberian Peninsula – This is the first killing of bulls for spectacle

Bull Fighting Continued

- 1133 AD First official Bull Fight (Corrida) occurs in Central Spain by King Alfonso VIII to celebrate the defeat of the Moors in the region
- ➤ 1726 AD the modern Corrida was invented and Bull fighting arena were created all over Spain
 - When have a bull fight? Birthdays, festivals, celebrations





- > 2011 AD Catalonia (Barcelona) Bans bullfighting
- 2019 AD Globalxpeditions will tour the famous arena of Sevilla

How is Bull Fighting Viewed in Spain Today

 According to the last official survey performed by Investiga-Aedemo, 67,2% of Spaniards show no interest in bullfighting.

Last date for ANY name changes (\$200 fee after this date)

Please confirm that all participants' first, middle, and last names (including your own) are spelled correctly and match EXACTLY as they appear on their passports. Also, confirm all birth dates are listed and correct. Make sure to send Explorica your passport information

Last Day for Individuals to Submit any Special Travel Requests - please have any travelers interested in doing this contact us before this date. (Staying longer, special rooming, food allergies, etc.) flight stay behind changes (for a \$195 fee anytime after enrollment),

Participants NOT on monthly auto-pay 75% of Tour Balance Due on 2/27/2019 for all participants (The remaining amount 25% IS DUE BY April 13, 2019)

Passports

Valid through December 2019 (6 months after our return date)

➤ If anybody has not ordered their passport yet, you need to get on that ASAP



ALSO... Double check that the name on your Explorica account matches your passport EXACTLY

Luggage

- Pack once, then remove 1/3 ©Pack light
- Parents have the final say on what you pack



- Lost luggage pack your backpack with essentials ... just in case
- One small carry-on plus one personal Item
- Pack an extra bag and send gifts home



See sample packing list (on website)

- **Carry-on:** Airlines may vary ... but industry standards
 - The maximum dimensions cannot exceed any of the following measurements:
 - > 22" long x 14" wide x 9" tall or 114cm (56 x 35 x 23 cm).

Personal Item:

- ➤ Includes: backpack, purse, briefcase, laptop bag OR a similar item such as a tote that does not exceed 36 inches(length+width+height) and must fit under the seat in front of you.
- Baggage Weight Limits
 - 26 pounds Total per traveler
 - (includes carry-on and in-cabin item)
- Checked Luggage: Two checked luggage items with no charge... on the way home



Dressing to Avoid Attention



You are a target for unwanted attention when you dress for attention

- Parents have veto power on clothes
 - Go through what it packed
 - This is not a fashion show, it is an educational tour
- Dress Code for Religious sites

Liquids, Gels, and Meds

- Remember hotels will have shampoo/conditioner/soap
- Pack limited liquids 1 quart-size clear plastic zip lock
 - ➤ Toiletries shampoo, toothpaste, mouthwash, perfume, shaving foam, aerosols, deodorant, eye care products
- Have all medications in their original packaging and have the prescription on hand.

Visiting religious sites

> Behave calmly and respectfully.

Show your respect: short prayer in front of the sacred object or by throwing a coin into the offering box, followed by a short prayer.

> Clothing:

Access is permitted only to visitors dressed appropriately (no sleeveless blouses, no miniskirts, no shorts, no hats allowed).

Photography

Usually permitted but there will be exceptions. It is forbidden in the Sistine Chapel for instance. Watch for signs.



A few more travel tips

Do try to speak the language. Everyone appreciates the effort, but may respond in English as they love to practice what they've learned (will practice next meeting)

Do dress appropriately when visiting churches. When entering any church in Italy, be sure that your shoulders, knees and midriff are covered

Don't eat and **do** turn off cell phones when visiting museums and churches. Do keep your voice down also.





Do expect to walk a lot – wear comfortable shoes



Don't be surprised to find businesses and shows closed for an hour or two between 1 p.m. and 4 p.m

Do eat sweets every day. It's that good
