




Meet our Tour Director





Hotel Safety



Travel Smart, Travel Safe

- Avoid wearing items that identify you as an obvious foreigner or otherwise call attention to your nationality, including clothing with logos.
- Most incidents can be avoided by using good sense and staying out of dangerous situations
- Be aware of your surroundings and suspicious activities. Always put your money in a money belt.
- If approached/threatened and told to hand over your valuables, do not resist. Everything can be replaced – except for you.
- Minority religions have freedom to practice but as always refrain from bringing up your specific religious beliefs.
- All travelers in Morocco are required to respect local dress and customs. Conservative attire, such as loose-fitting clothing that covers the legs and shoulders, is expected.




Flights – Middle seats and we are spread throughout the plane ... no requests allowed/changing seats







Last Minute Packing Reminders

Nurse Amy

- Do not wait to share your thoughts, feelings, and medical needs with Amy
 - She is here to help and be a resource while on tour
- Things Amy should know:
 - > If you are taking a medicine
 - If you start feeling ill
 - ➤ If your friend reports issues
 - If you have any dietary concerns/allergies/etc.





Constant reminders from Amy

- > Stay hydrated always This prevents illness, heat exhaustion, jet lag, etc.
- > Be care filling up your water bottles from local taps
 - Specifically in Morocco Use bottled water
- Use hand sanitizer and wash your hands often
- Keep sunscreen applied avoid being burned
- In case of an emergency Keep your emergency contact paper with you
- while traveling and follow the instructions. Also, know our meeting point
- > so you can find your leaders

Homesickness while on tour???

Know that homesickness is very common on all travel tours. You are away from home, in different beds, eating strange foods, and touring with new people. Don't be embarrassed if you are homesick. But you do need to work through it.

Here is how to work though your Homesickness:

While on tour:

- ➤ Make the most of your tour Stay positive
- Use your friends and roommates to minimize homesickness
 - Talk about it with them if needed
- > Make sure to check in at home every once in a while on tour
- If you start feeling overly homesick ... let Amy know!



If your child reaches out to you while on tour about being homesick:

- Remind your child that it is normal
- Keep your child positive Don't let them be upset and frustrated while on tour
- Encourage them to chat with their friends and Amy
